Welcome to FEATS 2002

The English Comedy Club of Brussels is delighted to welcome you all to the 26th Festival of European Anglophone Theatrical Societies.

Last year was a very special 25th Anniversary of FEATS arranged by the AATG in The Hague and it was fitting that it should be hosted by them. The late Mervyn Briscoe of the AATG began this beloved festival with two nights and six plays during the 1976 British Week in Rotterdam. Now we rotate between Brussels, Antwerp, The Hague, Frankfurt and Luxembourg. We've been to Geneva and we may even go to Hamburg in the future. The ECC sent out around 30 invitations to the groups on the FEATS list and still the list grows with groups wishing to take part. This year we are welcoming for the first time two groups from Stuttgart - one in the competition and one in the Fringe. Our adjudicator in Brussels this year is Mike Tilbury whom we also warmly welcome. Of course, there are those of you who have just come to see plays, in which case you will rarely find an opportunity to see such a wide variety of theatre.

For those new to FEATS, here is a brief synopsis of the rules, and the shape of the festival. Each evening three groups present the best overall production of a play of their choice, which may be an original script, one act of a full length play which stands on its own, or a one-act play. It must last between 25 and 50 minutes. There are two intervals of around 20 minutes and after the third play, following a brief pause when we ask you to remain in your seats, the adjudicator will give us his impressions of each play. On the day of performance, each group has two hours in the theatre, but only five crew are allowed 10 minutes to put up their set and 5 minutes to strike it after the show. If any of these rules are violated, penalty points are awarded. Our adjudicator, Mike Tilbury, will be following the marking system set down by the Guild of Drama Adjudicators and on Monday evening he will reveal the results and award prizes.

But FEATS is more than just a play competition: it's meeting old friends and making new ones, catching up on theatre stories, revelling in our favourite hobby. FEATS gives theatre enthusiasts the opportunity of seeing how different groups approach their production, proving that there is always more than one way to stage a play. We can discuss ideas and exchange techniques too. The theatre bar is a perfect venue for this and we shall stay open each evening as well as opening up at lunchtime for both food and drink. We hope to create a real festival spirit. We are running a Fringe around lunchtime on Saturday and Sunday and we have a new idea: Youth Fringe. This will take place at the Warehouse Studio Theatre in Schaerbeek on Monday and is to encourage the younger thespians among us. Look at the noticeboard by the Box Office to find out more.

The ECC is delighted to be able to provide permanent awards for Best Actor and Best Actress. Mrs. Barbara Blackwell is donating these two awards in memory of her late husband Blackie, who was for many years Chairman of the ECC and a great FEATS enthusiast. Like an Oscar or a Bafta, in future a "Blackie" may be awarded to the Best Actor and to the Best Actress, and the festival host group will give them a small token to keep.

There are many regular visitors to FEATS: some come to watch, some come to compete, and they come from all over the world. Indeed, we have on our ECC Festival Backstage Crew old friends who have flown in from very far away just to be part of the team! Some of us just can't keep away - so to competitors, Fringe-ers and anybody who has come along for the ride and the fun, "Break a Leg!" and have a wonderful weekend.

MIKE TILBURY GODA

Mike Tilbury has been actively involved in theatre all his life, dividing his time between acting, directing and adjudicating. He is a Council member of The

Guild Of Drama Adjudicators and is its immediate past Chairman during a period in which he was instrumental in bringing about considerable change and modernisation. He has sat a number of times on the examining panel at the Selection Weekend for prospective adjudicators and has run a number of acting workshops.

He is the current Chairman of The Drama Festivals Consortium, a body formed by representatives of the leading Festival organisations in England, Scotland, Northern Ireland and Wales. He has appeared in productions at the famous Minack Open-Air theatre in

Cornwall and is currently Chairman of Trinity Theatre Company based in Tunbridge Wells. His last productions as director have been Kay Mellor's A Passionate Woman, Tennessee Williams' The Glass Menagerie and Alan Aykbourn's Communicating Doors. Later this year he will be starting rehearsals


for his first French farce

His adjudicating work has taken him all over the country and also to Guernsey, Gibraltar and Spain, where he adjudicated the Costa Del Sol Festival - in English, with temperatures in the 90s and bats flying around the auditorium!

He has adjudicated the Welsh, Irish, Scottish and British Finals of the All England Theatre Festival as well as the NDFA All Winners Festival on two occasions. He has recently completed a two week Full Length Festival in Northern Ireland. His first FEATS was at Luxembourg two years ago and he is particularly delighted to be

returning this year to Brussels.

Performances will be on Saturday and Sunday, from about 11 am to 3 pm, in the red area by the bar. The schedule will be posted daily and is subject to change. This means that we will be ready and waiting for any and all eventualities . . . So, if Sunday on morning you are seized by the performance bug and just have to jump up and do your secretly rehearsed stand-up comedy routine that your dog just adores and that you've really been dying to have the nerve to try out in public . . . you can.

Of course, we like advance notice, too, and we've had loads of emails from (among others) the ATC, NEAT from Stuttgart, NWTC of Luxembourg, the Stockholm Players, and some cool people from this group that's called the ECC. There's going to be folk music, some Chekhov, *An Actor's Nightmare*, a group dynamics workshop, at least two monologues, and a group called Tiger Rose performing, quote, 'Music for Adults'!

Most performances will last roughly 30 minutes, so even if you can't come for the whole afternoon, drop by and see what's on the notice board. Support those brave souls who've decided that singing isn't just for the shower any more.

Don't miss Sybil's Super Sandwiches on sale at lunchtime and during the intervals each day. Or why not pre-order drinks for the intervals from Paul Davis and his team at the bar. The FEATS Bar is open at lunchtimes and before the performances, during the intervals and after the adjudications.

FEATS Youth Fringe sets the stage for young people

As part of this year's FEATS events, apart from the now traditional FEATS Fringe, the ECC is launching a new venture: Youth Fringe - to take place in the <u>Warehouse Studio Theatre</u>, 69a rue <u>Waelhem</u>, 1030 <u>Schaerbeek</u>. Several local Youth Groups have agreed to participate and the programme will provide a wide range of young people's theatre entertainment.

The day will include a presentation of a new play entitled 'Team Spirit' by the author Judy Upton, specially commissioned for the London Royal National Theatre's *International Connections Scheme* and performed by the Senior Youth Group of TIE (Theatre in English/Theatre in Education), designed by Janet Mayo and directed by Lynne Vaughan. A video of this play's world première is currently being judged by the RNT to see if a repeat performance can be justified in the Cottesloe space of the London National Theatre in July 2002. The TIE Junior Youth Group, led by Stephen Challens and Angela Martin, will present two short plays based on works by Ovid and Aesop. Pat Robinson's British Youth Theatre Society (BYTS) will perform 'The Island' - an original play written by the Society's founder Patti Arundel.

This is certainly a first and the ECC hopes that future FEATS Host Societies will follow up this exciting initiative to encourage Youth Theatre as part of the FEATS Fringe Festival. About the Story

A man stands upon a railroad bridge in northern Alabama. The time is the Civil War in America between the Yankee or Federal soldiers of the North and the Confederates of the South.

Ambrose Gwinett Bierce is still well-known for his Devil's Dictionary. Born in Ohio on 24th June 1842, he fought for the Union in the Civil War, prospected for gold, worked as a journalist for William Randolph Hearst and wrote short stories before literally disappearing in Mexico in 1914. This short story is, unlike the Devil's Dictionary, in no way facetious or cynical.

About the Group

The English Comedy Club of Brussels was founded in 1909 by a certain E.A. Erlich, although rumour has it that there was a group of amateurs who put on plays at around the time of the Battle of Waterloo in 1815. We share rehearsal space and a small studio theatre with the ITG and ATC in Schaerbeek and aim to put on two mainstage and two or three studio productions a season plus monthly playreadings. The ECC is a founding member of FEATS. The Club offers An Occurrence at Owl Creek Bridge as a curtain raiser to the festival and does not wish to compete with its guests, just to entertain them.

Narrator Robert Rowe has lived in Brussels for some years and represents, in a way, all the Brussels-based theatre groups, having directed plays for, or acted with, the ECC, ATC, BSS, BLOC and ITG. He has been chosen as Best Actor at FEATS twice, in 1985 and 1988, when he was with the New World Theatre Club in Luxembourg.

About the Play

About the Group

Other activities include theatrical workshops, a biennial Playwriting Competition and an annual Spring Barbecue. Membership is free to all who offer a helping hand, whether on or off stage. About the Play

About the Play

About the play

The starting point of this play is a true incident whereby a couple returned home to find asylum seekers on the couch.
