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
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

The Baseldytschi Bihni

Our host theatre is the home of "Baseldytschi Bihni". This is an amateur theatre club, which receives no financial aid. It has been in existence since 1892.

Before moving here to the Lohnhof in 1995 it resided at a Keller Theater in Leonardsstrasse. It comprises over 2000 members, 130 of whom actively work together running the theatre, putting on one of their own productions and four guest plays a year, and preparing their club newsletter: "Dr Lälli".

Albert R. Gurney

A.R.Gurney is one of America's most prolific and widely produced contemporary playwrights. His many plays include: Love in Buffalo, Tom Sawyer (musicals), The David Show, The Open Meeting, The Golden Fleece, Scenes from American Life, Children, The Dining Room, Richard Cory, The Middle Ages, The Golden Age, What I did Last Summer, Sylvia. He has also written several novels.

Born on November 1, 1930, A.R.Gurney grew up in an American middle-class environment. During the Korean War he served in the US Navy, where he wrote shows to entertain the military personnel. In 1955 he entered the Yale School of Drama and, following graduation, taught English and Latin at a boys' school and later joined the M.I.T. where he remains as a faculty member to this day.

Through a mixture of the commonplace and the bizarre, Gurney looks at the absurdities of American dysfunctional middle-class "WASP" society and while presenting his audiences with uncomfortable questions - he only gives hints at the answers. This is what makes directing and acting in an A.R.Gurney play so challenging and rewarding.

Four years ago, Sheila McKenzie and Rebecca Scriven asked me to take the part of "Husband" in A.R.Gurney's one-act play: *The Problem* which they were directing at that time for The Semi-Circle. We soon discovered that the play was all-too-aptly named, as it turned out to be not just a "Problem", but a very tough acting challenge. I was fortunate enough to be acting opposite Susannah Todd who played "Wife" and is now playing "Mona" in *The Guest Lecturer*.

We hope that through our efforts, we shall be able to share with you some of the fun and insight and technical skill of this fascinating playwright.
