# **WELCOME FROM THE PRESIDENT**

A very warm welcome to the Semi-Circle Autumn Production 2013, a collection of four short plays entitled "Greener Grass", a journey through hope, desire, intrigue and reconciliation. The Semi-Circle is a community theatre which aims to provide high-quality English-language theatre events to a wide audience through the development of skills and participation of members in all aspects of production. We present a full-length play in the spring or early summer and a collection of short plays in the autumn from which we may choose to take one forward to the Festival of European Anglophone Theatre Societies (FEATS) at the following year Pfingsten weekend. This year our spring production was Agatha Christie's "A Murder is Announced", directed by Eva Mann at the Theater Rampe. With this production we aimed to improve the overall experience of the evening, paying particular attention to the Front of House well as the authenticity of this period piece. The audience response was terrific, with around 950 seats sold and full houses on many evenings. After this show closed, Eva Mann went on to take her adaptation of "Penthesïlea" to London in July and to the Edinburgh Fringe Festival in August, where it was extremely well received.

This is my last production as President of the Semi-Circle and I will be standing down at the AGM in 2014 after four years in the chair. When I took on this role, the society was challenged by many external changes, was losing money, members and had lost access to its regular venue at the Schönes Haus. Since then, with the support and hard work of the committee, we have been able to find new venues, grow the membership, enhance the communications and publicity, bring the society back into profit and also put on shows such as "The Death of a Clown", "RENT", "The Shadow Box" and "A Murder is Announced" that have raised the bar in terms of artistic standards and the recognition of the Semi-Circle both locally and internationally. Perhaps most importantly, we have developed skilled and motivated production teams as the foundation on which the shows can be built and allowed the management of the productions to be more professional and less of a distraction for the directors. Finally, we have been able to move and rationalize our store of sets, props and costumes from the inconvenient Bäumlihof cellar to a more convenient but equally affordable cellar at Spiegelfeld.

This has been a hard but rewarding journey and I would like to thank the committee in its various guises for working with me through these changes and in particular Peter Hilton for his unwavering support as Secretary. The Semi-Circle is going forward with a plan for the future, an energetic committee and a the resources necessary to keep to keep putting on interesting shows and giving people a chance to become involved. I look forward to seeing you again at our spring production 2014, "Calendar girls" by Tim Firth (June 13 to 28 2014), as part of the audience, production team or at the auditions in the second week of January. Synopsis: Set at Chez Dominique, a fashionable restaurant. The action takes place in the private dining room. Couples collide in this comedic one-act when two would-be seducers decide to share a dining room. But are their companions really who they seem? From the mind of Georges Feydeau, an undisputed master of farce springs a portrait of a double date gone hilariously awry. Pompe-Nicole and Bordeleau arrive at Chez Dominique, where they encounter an overly-friendly maitre d' and his winsome wife. But madness ensues when their dates turn out not to be the ladies they appear. . . Everyone is a target and no one escapes unscathed from Feydeau's hilariously biting critique of class and seduction.



## Suzan Wilson-Sladek - Director

# The Extraordinary Revelations of Orca the Goldfish by David Tristram



"One of the many drawbacks of living in a house full of women is that a bad haircut cannot easily be downplayed. Thanks to the stand-in barber's failure to speak an intuitive

mélange of Italian, Spanish and English as I do and as my normal barber does, I was left one afternoon with a teenage No.2 on top, shaven ears and straggly 70s greasy locks curling erotically below my collar like a rustle of under-arm hair caught in the sink."

"One of the most bizarre pieces of advice I received while growing up (from a friend's mother) was that polite people always left something on their plates, and did not, as my own parents never failed to enjoin, "finish it up". It is now evident, in the new morality of sustainability, that this advice to leave food uneaten was plain bonkers. "Waste not want not" proves, like many Victorian epithets, to have multiple meanings, most of them true."

"Truth and reality are different perceptions. What companies say is not what is heard. Reputation is not brand, and being clear is not the same as being transparent. Just be honest, helpful and persuasive."

"Some companies get stubborn and self-righteous. They want not only to be right but they want proof and a certificate of it. Deep down, they want their critics to make public grovelling apologies, little realizing that in this they will lose credibility with their real customers and other stakeholders by beating the same drum over and over in a corporate trance like an addled hippy."

"I have never seen so many teenage girls in one place as outside that stadium before One Direction hit the stage at the Hallenstadion. There was 60s-style screaming in the air. Boys of any description were nowhere to be seen. Somehow it felt thrillingly pre-revolutionary."

It felt like the Flood had come to New York: pavements scattered with broken black umbrellas, gathered stark and broken in stricken clusters at swirling crossings. It made me wonder - what actually is the point of an umbrella?

"Celebrity obsession is no longer just a microculture for tired people, it is now the default multi-culture of the world, the filter through which modern morality and behaviour is forged and even politics is conducted."


