Director's Note

When I accepted this opportunity to direct She Kills Monsters, I was not sure I was the right guy for the job... I had never played Dungeons and Dragons before and the only thing I felt I had in common with the play was growing up in the typical American suburbs and graduating the same year as Tilly and the cheerleaders. But, as I embarked on my own journey to understand the play, as well as the game, I was struck with how diverse the world of DnD was. How the skills of each character were vital for the health of the team, and that in the end everyone won together or no one wins at all. In many ways the campaigns and adventures of Dungeons and Dragons allow players to live a fantasy and express their "badassness" on the inside when the world doesn't allow it on the outside.

Although the time period of this play and its place is inescapable, the lens we perceive the themes of diversity and being different is very much from the modern now. Qui Nguyen gives us a peek into early queer "geek" culture in the mid 90's, but now at the start of Pride month in 2022, we are in a much different place: one where we are able to celebrate our diversity in a way that our young adventurer Tilly would have only been able to dream of. Even though we still have roadblocks to conquer, she reminds us of the vast potential people have to live, love and play openly- which was what I tasked this creative team of actors and designers to do from the very beginning.

We can CELEBRATE what makes us different, to LIVE the geeky way we want, and to PLAY enthusiastically open!

Making Monsters

an interview with our monster creator Ginger

Where did you draw your inspiration for the monsters?

Some monsters jumped at me immediately, for others (such as the Bugbears or Tiamat) I had to do more research. Luca Manganelli was my consultant regarding the monsters' powers, attitudes and social habits. I didn't use standard imagery for the monsters – but for the kobolds I was inspired by the world of cosplayers – I kept having mischievous creatures no taller than 8 inches in mind, and they were certainly not suitable for our stages.



What materials did you use?

In part, we used upcycled scrap material. Given the amount of monsters and the time available, some of the components had to be modified and assembled. Mostly, we just had fun solving various challenges and experimenting with plastic insulation and hydraulic construction materials. Who would have thought that cable insulation would make such beautiful tentacles?

What was the process like?

Both technical and creative – we had to keep in mind movement, solidity and flexibility of the monsters, while also respecting aesthetics and the actors' comfort. They were all very sympathetic to our efforts! It cost us a few nights' sleep, but it was worth it.



What were the biggest challenges?

We had to imagine the weight the actors had to carry, the agility, lethality... The idea of the Bugbear arm was originated by Dominik, our fight choreographer. We also realised that the audience would see the monsters from all sides... They had to be visible and surprising from all angles – some pieces could be contrasting, while others could be more mysterious and... rise from the darkness...





Which monster is your personal favourite? Certainly the Mind Flayer. It's really alien and has creepy powers – and it's the one where I finally got to use liquid latex!

What is D&D?

Is there a nerdier thing than Dungeons and Dragons (also known as DnD)? Questionable. You may only know it from Stranger Things, but this game has been the leader in the role-playing game market ever since its release in 1977 and it is seriously fun. You'll see.

But how does it work, you ask? Well, it's a storytelling game, with one person being the narrator (or – put in a cooler way – dungeon master) and everyone else playing characters. Which they get to create themselves. Exactly, fun! Also, DnD uses seven really fancy, weird looking dice with a lot of numbers on them. They let the player see if their action will succeed, how much damage their weapon made, if their spells worked, and so on. Who and what they will face is all written down in the campaign (in our case, the campaign was written by Tilly), which is run by the dungeon master. The DM lets the players know where they are, who they face and what else is going on in the crazy world of DnD. In our game, this is Chuck. He will throw monsters like Liches, Dragons, Mind Flayers, Kobolds, Gelatinous Cubes and others (with similarly cool names) at our players.
